BACKGROUND

The much-awaited second edition of the <u>Canadian Circular Economy Summit (CCES)</u> will be taking place April 15-16, 2025 in Montréal, as we bring together visionaries, innovators, business leaders and sustainability advocates from across Canada and beyond for a transformative event.

The inaugural Canadian Circular Economy Summit (CCES) was held on June 19-20, 2023, at the new Toronto Region Board of Trade event space in downtown Toronto. The event brought together nearly 400 leaders in-person from across sectors and industries alongside the public sector to collaborate on efforts and activities, advance projects and investments, inform policies, and develop an Action Plan to accelerate the implementation of the circular economy in support of Canada's climate change, biodiversity, and innovation agendas.

Because of the success of CCES 2023, the second Canadian Circular Economy Summit will welcome 800 delegates to continue to raise the profile of the circular economy and its important role in delivering on critical environmental, economic and social imperatives. CCES 2025 will be guided by the Circular Economy Action Plan for Canada, and will serve as a 'checkpoint' for progress towards its outcomes.

Building on their preexisting efforts and collaborations, CELC and CIC will co-host the national CE Summit in collaboration with CERIEC at ÉTS, Ville de Montréal, RRECQ, and RECYC-QUÉBEC to bring together active and emerging CE leaders to Montréal, Québec to work together to identify the solutions, innovations, and cross-sectoral collaborations necessary for accelerating the transition to a CE in Canada.

- Amplify the key learnings of recent initiatives in Canada to build momentum on the associated action and research agenda.
- Encourage trade and investment opportunities by engaging the financial community, trade and export organizations, and domestic and international technology and innovation players.
- Highlight the innovation, research and progress being made towards the CE in Québec, and from across Canada and beyond.


